General Information

Minimum Requirements

The minimum requirements are the same for both ADN and PN applicants.

You may only apply to one program during each application period. You must choose either ADN or PN.

English Requirement



YOU MUST HAVE:

Placed into ENG 111 on the placement test within the past 3 years.

or

Completed all Developmental English

or

Completed an equivalent English class at another accredited college/university with a grade of “C” or higher.

or

Scored 500 or higher on SAT test within the past 5 years.....21 or higher on ACT test within the past 5 years.

Math Requirement

YOU MUST HAVE:

Placed into MAT 080 or higher on the placement test

or

Completed Introduction to Algebra (MAT 070) or higher at a North Carolina Community College

or

Completed a transferable Math equivalent to MAT 070 or higher with a grade of “C” or better at a college or university.

or

Scored 500 or higher on SAT test within the past 5 years.....21 or higher in Math on ACT test within the past 5 years



Chemistry Requirement

YOU MUST HAVE.....



Completed a high school or college/ university level chemistry class with a grade of “C” or better.

CHM 090/094 counts as High School level and does not award Bonus Points.

At this time Craven CC does not have a time limit of when the class must have been completed; however, this may be added in the future.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

You must have a current GPA of 2.5 or higher. If you have completed a minimum of 12 semester hours with Craven CC, and have not attended another college/university since completing those hours, we will use the Craven GPA.

If you have attended multiple colleges/universities, and have less than 12 semester hours at Craven CC, we will combine all GPA's to determine your current GPA. If you have less than 12 semester hours of college work, we will use your high school GPA, which must be 2.5 or higher. If you completed a GED, and have less than 12 semester hours of college work, you must have scored 2400 or higher on the GED.

TRANSCRIPTS

All “Official” transcripts must be turned in at the same time as your Nursing Application. If you are a current Craven CC student, you may print a copy of your transcript from WebAdvisor and attach it to your application. If you are not a current Craven CC student, you must submit Official Transcripts along with your Nursing Application each time you apply.

POINT SYSTEM

Craven CC currently uses a point system to determine who will enter the Nursing Program. Once an applicant has completed the entrance test (TEAS), bonus points earned are added to the TEAS score. The following slides will show how to earn bonus points.

CLASSES TAKEN IN SPRING 2012 WILL COUNT FOR BONUS POINTS.....

POINT SYSTEM FOR ADMISSION

Associate Degree Nursing

If you have graduated from high school **within the past year** with a GPA of 3.5 or higher (weighted or unweighted) and have less than 12 college credit hours..... **+30 points**

or



If you completed your GED **within the past year** with a score of 3000 or higher and have less than 12 college credit hours..... **+30 points**



POINT SYSTEM cont.

Associate Degree Nursing

If you have completed:

Chem 131, 151, or equivalent with a grade of C or higher..... + 5 points

Math 161, 151, 155, or higher with a grade of C or higher..... + 5 points

Bio 168 (A&P I)...Grade A ... +15 points

Grade B ... +10 points

Bio 169 (A&P II)...Grade A ... +15 points

Grade B ... +10 points

POINT SYSTEM cont.

Practical Nursing

If you have graduated from high school **within the past year** with a GPA of 3.5 or higher (weighted or unweighted) and have less than 12 college credit hours..... **+30 points**

or



If you completed your GED **within the past year** with a score of 3000 or higher and have less than 12 college credit hours..... **+30 points**



POINT SYSTEM cont.

Practical Nursing

If you have completed:

Chem 131, 151, or equivalent with a grade of C or higher..... + 5
points

Math 161, 151, 155, or higher with a grade of C or higher..... + 5
points

Bio 163 (A&P).....Grade A ... +30 points

Grade B ... +20 points

OR

Bio 168 (A&P I)...Grade A ... +15 points

Grade B ... +10 points

Bio 169 (A&P II)...Grade A ... +15 points

Grade B ... +10 points

NOTE: FOR PN ADMISSIONS, BONUS POINTS WILL BE GIVEN FOR BIO 168 AND 169 ONLY IF BOTH COURSES HAVE BEEN COMPLETED. APPLICANTS WILL NOT BE GIVEN BONUS POINTS FOR BIO 163 AND THE BIO 168, 169 SEQUENCE.

TEAS TEST

After submitting your Nursing Application, and found to be eligible, nursing applicants will be scheduled for a TEAS test (Test of Essential Academic Skills). Testing will be offered during the months of Feb/Mar/Apr.

TEAS TEST

There is a **\$25.00** charge for testing. This cost is subject to change, prior to the beginning of testing. Applicants may only test once during each application period. Scores will be accepted from other institutions if they are dated after January 1, 2012 and before April 30, 2012. If the applicant chooses to use scores from another institution, they will not be allowed to test at Craven CC.

BE SURE YOU ARE TAKING THE TEAS VERSION V EXAM!

TEAS TEST cont.

Testing will be conducted at the New Bern Campus. Applicants must be approved for testing prior to scheduling their exam.

Due to the high number of “No Shows” during past testing sessions, “No Shows” will not be allowed to reschedule if prior notification was not given.
